LEGISLATION

DAILY PHYSICAL ACTIVITY

Effective July 3, 2008, Section 4(1) of the <u>Educational Standards Order</u> was amended by adding daily physical activity as a required offering for grades 1 to 7. Section 4(3) was similarly amended for grades 8 and 9.

The <u>Graduation Program Order</u> was also amended July 3, 2008 in sections 1 and 4, requiring physical activity as set out in the <u>Daily Physical Activity Planning and Resource Guide Kindergarten to Grade 12</u>. The <u>Graduation Program Order</u> addresses the educational program requirements for grades 10 through 12, and is applicable to both public and independent schools.

BOOSTER SEATS

Effective July 1, 2008 <u>drivers</u> of vehicles must ensure children in their cars who are over 40lbs, and under 9 years of age, unless they have reached a height of 145 cm. (4'9") tall, use booster seats. For details consult <u>www.childseatinfo.ca</u> Schools will need to adjust their policies for drivers for field trips to reflect this new requirement made by amendments to the <u>Motor Vehicle Act</u> Regulation.

FIRST NATIONS

The Independent School Act has been amended as a consequence of the passage and implementation of the First Nations Education Act. The Independent School Act now includes definitions for First Nations schools, and clarifies that authorities of independent schools may make agreements about educational matters with First Nation schools that operate under the First Nations Education Act. They may also made agreements with the First Nations Education Authority.

CABINET SHUFFLE

On June 23, 2008 Premier Gordon Campbell announced several cabinet changes. The Hon. Shirley Bond, Minister of Education and Minister Responsible for Early Learning and Literacy and Deputy Premier retained her current portfolios. The FISA is pleased with the ongoing stability this creates for education and looks forward to continuing the good working relationship the FISA has established with the Minister's office.


NEW DEMOCRATIC PARTY CRITIC PORTFOLIO SHUFFLE


ASSOCIATION NEWS
