They will collaborate with educators to ensure the inclusion of all students in the educational process and assess the required support levels throughout the school year. The Learning Support professional will also devise strategic approaches for Individual Learning Plans to promote the success of all students in their educational pursuits.

Key Responsibilities

- Aid individual students as specified in an Individual Learning Plan (ILP) based on guidance from classroom teachers, specialists, counselors, and learning support teachers.
- Work closely with teachers to plan, develop, adapt, prepare, and implement curriculum, classroom materials, and schedules tailored to meet the needs of designated students.
- Maintain regular communication with the supervising teacher and other team members, including parents and relevant professionals.
- Observe and document student progress, keeping detailed written records as necessary.
- Supervise students both on and off the school campus as needed.
- Provide support to students with designated Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) or other mental & physical challenges.
- Address student needs through one-on-one sessions, small groups, and within the general classroom environment.
